### FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

### **CHRISTMAS STALL**

It is hard to believe that we only have two more weeks of school left for 2020. With the easing of restrictions, we have been able to plan and enjoy some of our annual activities. Monday's Christmas Stall was a wonderful success, the excitement our students showed at being able to browse and purchase independently was lovely to watch. We are incredibly grateful to our parent fundraising team who pulled this all together with not much more than 48 hours' notice. I hope all the children who purchased items at the Christmas Stall on Monday have wrapped these or hidden them carefully until Christmas morning!



### A DAY IN YEAR 7

On Wednesday our Grade 5 and Grade 6 students were • able to experience what school is like for a Year 7 student. Students were all assigned Homeroom Classes and had to follow a High School timetable for the day. The morning began with an address from Mullauna College's Vice Principal Jeff McMillin, they learnt about what they could expect at high school, including a 'how to' session on locker combination locks. Second period was a Science lesson with Mr Norman from Ringwood Secondary College, students learnt to understand the importance of observations in Science and then to use those observations to answer an investigation question, treated to some exciting demonstrations, and the opportunity to conduct their own experiment. I think most of our Grade 6 students are very excited about exploring their High School Science Labs. Back in

their Year 7 classrooms, the taste of High School continued with lessons in Product Design and Advertising. Mr Koles, Miss Cirillo, Miss Gerostathos and Miss Cerra our Grade 5/6 teachers did an amazing job ensuring students felt that they were at High School.
