# FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

## TRANSITION PROGRAM

What a terrific week!

Our third Whole School Mainstream Transition Session was held on Monday and our students Transitioned with confidence and excitement. Confidence, excitement and a little nervousness was also experienced by our graduating year 6 students as many of them headed off on Tuesday to their 2021 Schools for the Year 7 Public School Transition Day. While our Graduates were out we welcomed our 2021 Grade Prep students for a very special 'Meet Your Class' morning, their enthusiasm and eagerness to start school was incredible! On Monday next week, all of our students from Grade Prep - Grade 5 will take part in our 'Moving Up' morning, during this time students will meet their 2021 classmates and classroom teachers. Many hours of work have gone into ensuring all our students are placed into a learning environment that will support their individual learning needs.



## MITCHAM MATES

Wednesday saw the launch of our new vertical team Wellbeing program 'Mitcham Mates', Mitcham Mates is a wellbeing program where students are grouped into vertical teams based on their house. Each group has students from P-6 in it and provides an opportunity for students to build connections with others from all over the school. These groups also give students an

opportunity to build relationships with other teachers within the school. Wednesday's activities included tabloid sports and getting to know you activities. Students also discussed the importance of school-wide values; what they think the values of Mitcham Primary School are and if our existing school values need to be improved to reflect changes in the world and our school community. The students' thoughts and reasons for their recommendations were so well considered, we were so impressed by the seriousness that our students approached this task with and there understanding of the importance of their student voice in reshaping our school values.



This project will continue in 2021, with the opportunity to contribute to the redesign of our school values being extended to our parents and staff also. Mitcham Mates will become a regular occurrence next year.

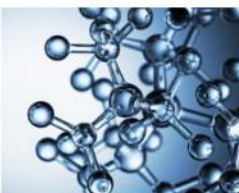
