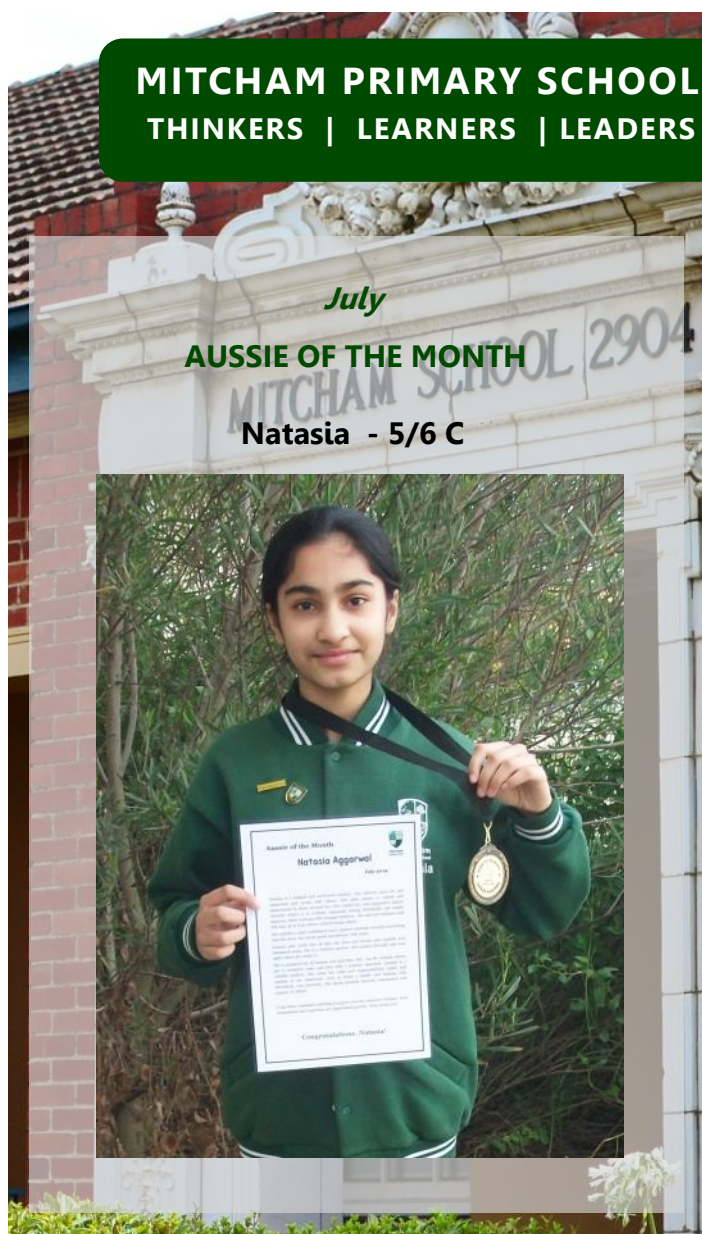

OSHCLUB CLOTHING RECYCLING PROGRAM

OSHClub is organising a Clothing Recycling Program at school called "Mondo". Mondo means 'World' in Italian, and by getting involved in the Mondo program we are going to make the world a healthier place by saving unwanted clothing from ending up in landfill.

We are asking families to donate any old or unwanted clothing, shoes and linen – 100% of which can be reused or recycled through our Mondo program.

A collection truck will be at school on **Tuesday 17 September** from 8:30 to 9:15 am. We would be grateful if you could please bring in donations from **Thursday 12 September**.

Your donated items are sorted and graded. They are then either distributed to communities who can use them, recycled, or made into bio-fuel.

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Term 3 Newsletter

Welcome Back, and THANK YOU!

Welcome back to Term 3! It has been wonderful to see all the students return to school happy and healthy. They have settled back into their classrooms quickly, and some fantastic learning is already underway.

We also wanted to extend an enormous thank you to all the parents who have been coming to school to read with the students. The program is highly valued by the teachers and students, and is now regarded as an important part of our Reading program.

We are always open to more people coming on board, so if you think you might be available between 8:45-9:00am on any morning, please let your classroom teacher know.



Term Overview

Literacy

In Literacy, this term we will continue with using the Workshop model, while we unpack two units of work entitled "Stories to Tell", and "I Am A Poet". In the unit of work "Stories To Tell", our Grade 4 students will have the opportunity to visit a nursing home and interview residents to learn more about their lives. Using the information collected, all Grade 3 and 4 students will participate in creating Historical Fiction picture books that use details from the residents' lives to tell their story. Then, all students will return to the nursing home to share the stories they have created with the residents they interviewed. In our unit of work "I Am A Poet", students will have the opportunity to explore poetry in many forms, through both writing and reading a range of different types of poems. Towards the end of the term, students will use their newfound understanding of poetry to create a short anthology that showcases their own works, and they will also do an analysis of poetry written by different authors.

Mathematics

We have started Mathematics this term looking at Money, and students have enjoyed practising hands on skills such as calculating change when shopping. It was great to see the fantastic conversations being had during our change investigation this week, and to watch the students work collaboratively and share their reasoning with each other. Later this term, we will also investigate fractions, and number patterns. The students will also continue to participate in regular Number Talks this term, which encourages them to work with numbers mentally, and use reasoning skills to articulate their strategies.

Inquiry

Our Inquiry unit this term is called "Waste Not, Want Not". Students will investigate the physical properties of different objects, and how manufacturers consider the physical properties of materials when designing and creating items. Later this term, students will explore upcycling, and use design thinking skills to create their own upcycled artwork.

Respectful Relationships

This term, our 'Respectful Relationships' lessons will continue to focus on managing difficult emotions, and developing positive coping strategies to support students. Students continue to engage in Respectful Relationships classes in an open, responsible and respectful manner, and by sharing their ideas and experiences provide valuable support for their peers.

3/4 Camp

This year, the Grade 3/4 camp will be held in Narmbool. The payment, permission, dietary requirements medical information forms have been distributed, and final payments are due by the 14th of August. Thank you to all those who have returned these already.

Further information, including packing list, will be distributed soon.

Teachers will be preparing the students at school by discussing camp activities, camp life, and viewing photos of the venue. They will be available to answer any questions from students in the weeks leading up to it.

EXCITING NEWS

The Department of Education and Training (the Department) is planning to commence an assessment and rating of our service. The purpose of the assessment and rating is to determine whether, and at what rating level, a service meets the National Quality Standard (NQS), and the National Law and National Regulations. As part of the assessment and rating of our service, an authorised officer will visit our service between 26 August 2019 and 23 September 2019.

UPDATE IN THE BOOKING POLICY FOR BSC AND ASC SESSIONS

- Parents will not be able to book online within 24 hours as the system is locked 24 hours before the session commence time.
- Parents can book their child(ren) into the program on the day by calling or texting 0422 097 497.
- Program times are from 7am—9am and 2:30pm—6:30pm, bookings will be confirmed during these times.

- A late booking fee of \$4 will automatically be charged when a booking is made at short notice (0-24 hrs ahead of the start time of the session). This fee was waived last term for goodwill as the CCS was stabilising – it is part of our usual T&C's.
- When a child is booked but does not attend, and there's been no notification that they will be absent, a \$5 'no-show' fee will be incurred.
- Our cancellation policy is now 48 hours before the session commences. Cancellations within 48 hours will incur full fee.
